## STOP PRESS : Nowa Nowa to Orbost - Full Steam Ahead

**\$600,000** has been allocated by Deputy Prime Minister and Leader of The Nationals (Federal Transport Minister) John Anderson to complete the rail trail, from Nowa Nowa to Orbost, and undertake maintenance on the existing sections.

Speaking to an expectant crowd beside the rail trail at Bruthen on a sunny Tuesday morning September 28th The Nationals Member for Gippsland, Peter McGauran introduced Mr Anderson and handed out the joint media release which broke the amazing good news. Local media, trail supporters and management committee members present enthusiastically responded to the announcement.

Mr McGauran went on to say “Congratulations must go to the East Gippsland Rail Trail management committee, the Friends of the East Gippsland Rail Trail and local communities that have worked tirelessly to raise funds to complete the trail and undertaken working bees to maintain the existing track. This rail trail will provide visitors to the area with a unique experience of East Gippsland’s natural environment and establish East Gippsland as a first choice destination for domestic and international visitor,” Mr McGauran said.

So indeed, wonderful and unexpected news for all who have already pitched in to help get this rail trail to reality.

EG TAFE via a cable laying contractor has also approached the Rail Trail Committee of Management re laying an anoptic fibre cable along part of the trail (Bairnsdale to Nicholson) to link Bairnsdale, Forestech and Seamac (L.E.) TAFE campuses. Part of the construction would involve a considerable amount of suitable revegetation. This would be an opportunity to develop a longer term relationship with the TAFE for ongoing involvement in assisting with maintenance of this section of the trail.

## **FUNDING APPLICATIONS**

The Friends were successful in our application for a Small Equipment Grant. We are

looking forward to purchasing our own tools for use on maintaining the trail.

We have also applied to the East Gippsland Shire Council for a Community Grant to assist with development of Nicholson Walk, a 4Km circuit including the rail trail. If successful, the funding will be used for seats, a shelter and replanting after removal of dead wattles.

## **YOUNGS CREEK FALLS RIDE**

A group of the Friends rode out to Young Creek Picnic Area and Falls last Sunday. At about ten kilometres north of Orbost, the reserve is a fairly easy ride along the forest roads.

It took just over an hour to reach the picnic area, a shady spot with picnic tables and barbecues, surrounded by the tall Mahogany Gums common to this

region. A foot track winds down Youngs Creek to the base of the falls in a beautiful gully filled with Kanooka, tea-tree, ferns and moss. We were fortunate that the 13 metre falls were running as, so often in summer they are dry. Across the road from the picnic area the remains of a steam engine that powered a sawmill in the 1920's lies rusting in the overgrowth.

After a lunch break we headed back to Forest Park, stopping several times to look at and discuss some of the historic sites of Orbost - two old abattoirs and a huge paddock bequeathed to the local school by an early settler. Eddy has a vast store of historical knowledge of the Orbost district and it's great to learn about the early times from him. The weather stayed fine, the company, as always was friendly and the physical exertion satisfying! Marlene Robb
